This is my second year in Japan. For me, Sapporo is a friendly place and people here are very kind and gentle.

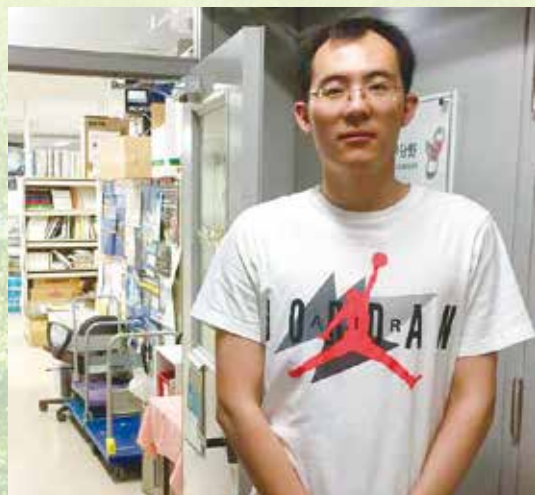
