Hokudai is well known to its international students as being one of the prime public institutions in Japan. Located in Hokkaido, Hokudai's surrounding natural environment has four different types of beauty that corresponds with each season. Due to its abundant natural beauty, many international students choose Hokudai as a place to study in Japan.

In recent years, there have been significant number of Muslim students amongst other international students also studying at Hokudai. As most people know, a Muslim is expected to pray five times every day. However, there are no designated prayer places in Hokudai. Although Muslim students



have access to a Mosque (Sapporo Islamic Society Mosque, Kita 13 Nishi 3), it is very difficult to get there in the winter and during busy study periods.

In view of this, it would have been much better and convenient for Muslim students if there were prayer rooms in each faculty within Hokudai to enable them to practice their religion without unnecessary inconveniences.

Effective Diet Support for International Muslims イスラム教徒の人たちへの食事サポート

Three students from the Tenshi College Department of Nutritional Science presented their research papers concerning "DIET SUPPORT" for International Muslims living in Sapporo. Their method of research was to conduct questionnaires on Muslims at a Mosque and to analyze the completed

questionnaires. Almost all of the Muslims interviewed for the questionnaires were International students of Hokkaido University.

According to the results achieved from this research study, most Muslims focused on problems relating to food distinction between HALAL AND NON-HALAL food products. Their strongest recommendation was to indicate the names of raw materials more clearly on the packages of each food product.

The Tenshi College students suggested that the most effective diet support for Muslims would be the construction of a word table in which the names of the raw materials that are banned by their religion are shown

both in Japanese and English.

These conclusions appear to provide strong sociocultural merits for the design and implementation of such a word table.
